In an effort to assist the community in better understanding police training, procedures and



philosophy, the Metro Chiefs Association offers an eleven week Citizens Police Academy (CPA) to all citizens and members of local civic and governmental organizations. Participants of the Citizens Police Academy are given the opportunity to experience first hand many areas of police-training. The classes offered closely parallel the training curriculum that police officer candidates experience and are "mini-capsules" of the entire basic training program. partnerships between citizens and police. The CPA will provide a meal at 5:30 pm every night at no cost to the participant.

After experiencing the CPA, graduates are invited to join a CPA Alumni Association; where they will be exposed to advanced police training, meaningful volunteer opportunities and a forum where graduates can utilize their new knowledge of police work

to discuss current problems in the area from an informed perspective.
